



## 6. Architecture Walk

Hong Kong offers a wealth of architectural influences and styles just waiting to be discovered. During this walk through Hong Kong's Central district, visitors will come to understand the evolution of the city through its buildings. Architect hosts will point out the special characteristics that make each structure unique as well as discussing its relevant history.

Thrusting skyward in dramatic contrast to these historical structures are Hong Kong's many glass and

steel monuments to modernism. Designed by some of the world's most renowned architects, they are vital to understanding the evolution of building styles and the way Hong Kong's urban architecture has changed during the past century.



- Meet at Hong Kong Planning and Infrastructure Exhibition Gallery, G/F, Murray Road Multi-storey Car Park Building, 2 Murray Road, Central, Hong Kong (till end of April)

The Gallery will be relocated to City Hall Annex, 3 Edinburgh Place, Central, Hong Kong (from May onwards)

- MTR Central Station, Exit J2. Walk straight along the walkway alongside Chater Garden. The Gallery is located opposite the Bank of China Tower on the Ground Floor (till the end of April).

MTR Central Station, Exit K, next to City Hall (from May onwards).
